

Landcare in East Gippsland has received a \$150,000 grant from Landcare Australia with funding from News Corp Australia for supporting environmental bushfire recovery. The grant aims to contribute to habitat protection, enhancement, and augmentation on private property in fire affected areas of East Gippsland.

Landcare will be working with rural communities and landholders to promote bushfire recovery and rebuilding of habitat for local threatened wildlife on private land in East Gippsland.

With the funding available, Landcare is rallying up local landholders who are interested in planting native trees on their property to support habitat rehabilitation. Landholders will also be reimbursed for approved fencing works.

Funding announced for Balley Hooley campside canoe launch

Announcements for Round 2 of the Local Economic Recovery grants were made on 31 May 2021 and we're very pleased to say that our application was successful! The funding will be used to install a canoe launch facility at Balley Hooley campsite on the Snowy River. This project involves building a multi-purpose facility that will enable the easy removal of rafts and canoes from the Snowy River. It will also act as swimming access for campers and day visitors. It will increase tourism to the area, reduce erosion and make it safer for all visitors to access the river. The construction of the project will be managed by Parks Victoria.

We continue to work with Parks Victoria to ensure key visitor and tourist attractions are open and maintained to the standard expected. We are discussing further improvements such as a significant upgrade to the Balley Hooley Campground. Parks Victoria representatives are regular guests to our Committee meetings.

The classes are free and open to all adults in the district on a first come, first served basis with 12 spaces available. They will run over a 6-week period to begin with but may go for longer if the program is supported!



Hello from the Buchan and District Bushfire Recovery Hub!



On Saturday 22 May we hosted the cast and crew screening of "Fired Up", a short film and photographic exhibition of the Black Summer Bushfires. The Australian Federal Police, Australian Islamic Centre and Human Appeal have joined over the last year to culminate an amazing project which has resulted in an award nominated short film and a photo exhibition which complements the power of the film.

A generous team from the Australian Islamic Centre and Human Appeal provided an amazing BBQ under a clear Autumn sky with lamb kofta wraps. The crowd of around 80 Buchan district locals and Nowa Nowa and Johnsonville guests browsed the images and recollections supplied by those mainly on the fire front.





"Fired Up" showed the logistical hurdles teams crossed to access these areas and some touching interviews where cultures embrace for a great result. The film showed the generous effort and extreme level of adaptability and commitment that these organisations showed immediately after the Black Summer events. From organising trucks of food, water and essential supplies to be delivered to desperate communities in East Gippsland, to cooking for those in need with free BBQs and lending a consoling ear. We would like to acknowledge the film as a collaboration between

AFP, Blueprint Studios, Australian Islamic Centre (AIC) and Human Appeal. We thank the AFP, AIC and Human Appeal for premiering the film in front of a local crowd on home soil, bringing this event to the people on the ground.

Buchan Main Street and Linkages Project

June 2021 | Fact Sheet 1



Project Description

The Buchan Main Street and Linkages
Project will boost the tourist economy by
improving access to Buchan's town centre
and enhancing its appeal, encouraging
people to stop, stay and spend. It will also
increase accessibility for the local community
to move around town more safely and
instinctively.

Council secured \$2.8 million for this project. This funding can explore improvements and refurbishments such as:

- · Reconfiguring the service roads
- Optimising car parking
- Increasing visual appeal of the streetscape
- Landscaping and improved street furniture

A shared path link to the Buchan Caves campground will be introduced to facilitate tourist movement between the popular tourist destination and the town proper, to encourage campers and glampers to walk or cycle to town and spend.

Social and business infrastructure will be designed to leverage the main street and linkage pathways investment and provide existing and new businesses a 'wrap-around' service which may include training for key skills, new events and enterprise facilitation services.

This project will be undertaken in two parts:

- Buchan Caves Reserve Linkage
- 2. Buchan Streetscape Refurbishment

The statistics

- The economic impact of bushfires followed by COVID19 in Buchan has been catastrophic.
 December 2019 to January 2020 expenditure was down by 68% and visitation plummeted.
 Visitors to the Buchan Caves Reserve decreased by 58%.
- Approximately 140,000 people visit the caves each year (before bushfires and COVID19) but spend only \$5.30 on average in the town (plus \$22 caves entrance). The Gippsland regional daily spend for a day tripper is \$93 and for an overnight visitor is \$335. Clearly the spend in Buchan is very low, providing significant opportunity for growth.
- Based on analysis even if only 10% of visitors to the caves visit the town and increase spend per visitor from \$5.30 to \$40 (still significantly less than the \$93 average) there would be an increase of 8 jobs and annual spend of \$966,000.
- The main street and linkages project provides direct employment for an expected 16 jobs for construction. It is expected these jobs would be local and where possible provide particular opportunities for traditional owner construction crews.

What has happened to date?

 Funding has been secured via the Victorian Government's Local Economic Recovery Bushfire Recovery Economic Stimulus Fund (LER) Program, which is jointly funded by the Australian and Victorian governments; East Gippsland Shire Council has committed cash and in-kind project management.

- Design for the Buchan Caves Linkage has commenced.
- Council is further refining a project plan and timelines.

What will happen next?

- In-person community consultation and engagement sessions will begin in Buchan in July with regular sessions to follow.



BUSHFIRE RECOVERY

12 MONTHS OF PUBLIC LAND WORKS

THE REAL PROPERTY AND ADDRESS OF THE PARTY.

Since the 2019-20 bushfires, government agency teams have been busy working to repair, rebuild and, where possible, improve impacted assets and values in the Buchan district.

There have been many wins over the past 12 months, and we're pleased to share some highlights from this time, and our plans for the upcoming months.

A significant amount of damaged or destroyed infrastructure is now back in place around the area, including track signage and fluming used to divert water away from culvert outlets and prevent erosion. Two new concrete bridges spanning Spring Creek at the Fairy Cave end of the Buchan Caves. Reserve have been installed to replace the wooden ones bunt in the fires.

Roadside vegetation management inclusive of weed spraying or slashing has been completed in the Buchan South, Timbarra and Nunnett areas. Road access improvement works have been completed at Glenmore Road, as well as grading works at Nunnett and Mellock Munjie Roads.

Additionally, the fencing replacement program has seen the completion of over 80 grants to fix fencing damaged during the fires from Nowa Nowa to Wulgulmerang.

In the coming months, works will commence to repair the landslips on Cutts Creek Road and replace culverts at Mt Johnson Road, Tulloch Ard Road, New Guinea Road and Running Creek Link Track.

There will also be further drainage repair works around the area including Devils Den Track and Pink Rocks Track

While we're happy to share these wins, we know there's more to be done. Our teams will continue to work with the Gelantipy and District Renewal Association to 'build back better' and respond to community needs.

The Buchan, Gelantipy & Districts Renewal Association (BGDRA) was furned because of the bushfire events of 2019/2020. The representative group of community members was brought together to voice the community's needs in recovery. Their purpose is to get individuals and communities back on their feet after the bushfires by delivering on and advocating on behalf of the needs of the community. identifying and addressing any shortfalls that may arise, creating a Community Renewal Plan that strives for the benerment of the community, and endeavouring to increase economic activity within the

Progress So Far

Update from Parks Victoria and Gunaikurnai Land and Waters Aboriginal Corporation

Since the black summer bushfires, we have been working hard to safely restore access to our parks and support regeneration of the natural environment.

Recovery at Buchan Caves Reserve, situated on Krauatungalung Country, has been a priority for joint managers Gunaikurnai Land and Waters Aboriginal Corporation and Parks Victoria. We have reinstated visitor access to the campground, cave tours, majority of the walking tracks and put considerable effort into removing hazardous trees, weed eradication, revegetation, maintaining the grounds and general clean-up works to provide a clean, open and safe park for our visitors. Rangers are working to open the connection between Granite Pools and Kanooka walking tracks by reinstating the steps that were lost after the fires and on-going heavy rainfall.

Unfortunately, the last remaining wooden bridge at Buchan Caves Reserve is no longer accessible, due to significant structural damage.

The campground is closed and there is currently no vehicle access across Bridge No.2, part of the main road

to the Visitor Centre, caves and campground. Until a temporary bridge is installed, visitors and staff are required to park prior to the bridge and walk 500 metres to the Visitor Centre. Please be aware that there is very limited parking available between the entrance gate and the damaged bridge. Scoping work is underway for a temporary bridge so access for vehicles can be reinstated while the closed bridge is replaced.

Once vehicle access is restored, we will continue to progress the rebuild of insurable assets such as the Guide Room, Fairy Cave Entrance and Spring Creek walking track steps and viewing platform.


Scoping of work to reopen the swimming pool to comply with regulations is underway. Planning is well underway for the first phase of the \$2 million program funded by Regional Development Victoria to reopen, rebuild and upgrade the Buchan Caves Reserve visitor precinct. ASPECT Studios Pty Ltd have been engaged to provide a Site Concept Plan, to progress key actions from the Gunaikurnai and Victorian Government Joint Management Plan, guide future facilities development and associated investment for the site to build visitation to the area and economic benefit to local tourism. In the Snowy River National Park, we have ongoing maintenance for walking tracks, campsites and lookouts and have recently completed roadworks at Bally Hooley and Old Basin, providing good two-wheel-drive access to these popular visitor sites. Post-fire vegetation management has been a major issue and weed control has been completed in many spots throughout the park, including the Potholes Reserve.

We're pleased to report a total of 47 Brush-tailed Rock Wallabies were detected in a recent monitoring program. This is a great result and indicates our comprehensive predator control program is having a positive impact. This critically endangered species only occurs in two places in the wild here and the Grampians National Park. Victoria's deer and feral animal control program has given the natural environment across Eastern Victoria a fighting chance at recovery, with more than 2,000 target animals being removed from target areas, including 32 from Buchan Caves Reserve. We have also seen a significant reduction in deer, feral pigs, foxes and goats in the Snowy River National Park. Following the release of the Bushfire Management Strategies, the Forest and Fire Management Planning team have produced a StoryMap website. The StoryMap product displays information published in the Bushfire Management Strategies in an interactive way. Strategic bushfire management planning is about bringing together land and fire managers, communities and stakeholders to develop a common understanding of bushfire risk and determine strategies and actions to reduce that risk.



The children sighed with relief at hearing the news.


Harry concluded, "And so, you will hear the cows giving slightly different moos when calling their calves, usually at dinner time."

GET ACTIVE KIDS

VOUCHER PROGRAM

The Get Active Kids Voucher Program helps eligible families get their kids involved in organised sport and recreation activities by reimbursing the cost of membership and registration fees, along with uniforms and equipment essential for participation. Eligible children may be able to receive up to \$200 each.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

To be eligible for a voucher your child / dependant must be:

- · goed 4 to 18 years
- a resident in Victoria
- named on a current (at the time of your application) Australian Government Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, and
- named on a valid Australian Government Medicare card

You can apply for more than one voucher if you have more than one eligible child/dependant.

FUNDING DETAILS

You can be reimbursed up to \$200 for costs related to:

- membership, registration or general fees to participate at an affiliated sport or active recreation club, association or program
- equipment (new or second hand) required to participate in the nominated activity
- uniforms and clothing (new or second hand) required to participate in the nominated activity
- You must pay for the membership, registration fees, equipment or uniform first

You must have incurred membership expenses within eligible expenditure dates to claim unifrom and equipment expenses.

You will then be reimbursed for part or all of the cost up to the value of \$200

ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES

- the activity or program must be affiliated to a Victorian Government recognised Victorian State Sporting Association or Victorian State Sport and Recreation Body
- activities or programs should be a minimum of four sessions
- organised sport or outdoor recreation programs or camps involving multiple sessions of activities wich may be conducted over one or more days will be eligible

WHEN CAN YOU APPLY?

There are specific dates (claim periods) when you can apply. You must have incurred your expenses within specific dates too. Please refer to the table below:
